Sharrows are bicycle shaped stencils applied to the street to let motorists know that they are especially likely to find bicycles in that area – thus "share" with bicycles. Hopefully this summer we'll have a crosswalk across Lincolnton to Burger King. That would be great!!

Destiny City Breathes New Life into Ridge Avenue

New neighbors are coming to Ridge Avenue. The congregation of Destiny City is currently working to renovate the old Foursquare Gospel Tabernacle behind Mambo Grill. The church has sat empty since Foursquare moved to its new location on Mooresville Road and became World Hope Worship Center several years ago.

Destiny City, pastored by Dr. Don Vess, is a community and outreach-focused church "that's the same on Tuesday as it is on Sunday," says member Brian Walker. Established in 2010, Destiny City currently meets on the campus of Livingstone College in the Student Chapel. They are committed to the community in and around Fulton Heights, and they look forward to seeing their church becoming a thriving part of the neighborhood.

Destiny City was gifted the Ridge Avenue property in January 2014, and they immediately got to work. On Saturdays, you'll find members meeting there for a little fellowship and a lot of sweat equity—doing demolition and getting the property stable again. There's been considerable water damage to the belfry, but the bones of the 1913 structure are strong. The sanctuary has gorgeous hardwood floors laid in an unusual arched pattern. It's something you just have to see!

Unfortunately, the church was recently featured on an episode of the hit DIY Network show Salvage Dawgs where it was stripped of its stained glass, including its famed half-moon window and enormous pocket door. The show's producers also took several lighting fixtures dating to the 1950s.

But, Destiny City is certain they can put the building back together piece by piece with a little hard



work and lot of prayer. They hope to move their services DestinyCity there within the next two years. If you're interested in seeing the work they're doing, they're around most Saturday

The goal of Food for Thought, a 501 (c)3 not-for-profit organization, is to provide nutritious food on weekends to the most "food insecure" children at the 14 Rowan County schools we serve, including Koontz Elementary and Knox Middle School.

Food for Thought and its sixteen community partners are currently packing over 1,100 backpacks each month filled with nutritious, shelf-stable, non-perishable food. It costs approximately \$25 to serve a child for one month.
