Tips to prevent loss as the weather is warmer and "wanderers" visit our alleys, backyards, side porches and cars.

- 1. Lock house door and windows when not at home.
- 2. Do not leave purses on car seats.
- 3. Turn on porch lights.
- 4. Close and lock sheds and garages.
- 5. Do NOT leave bikes, lawnmowers, etc visible in backyards.
- 6. WHEN YOU SEE OR HEAR SUSPECIOUS BEHAVIOR CALL 911!!!!!!!
- 7. Call police with all identifying things you observed or heard.
- 8. If you do not want the responding officer to come to your house, say "DO NOT COME TO MY HOUSE", call me for further information.
